Inspire others and engage stakeholders

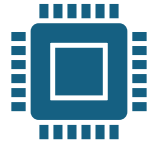

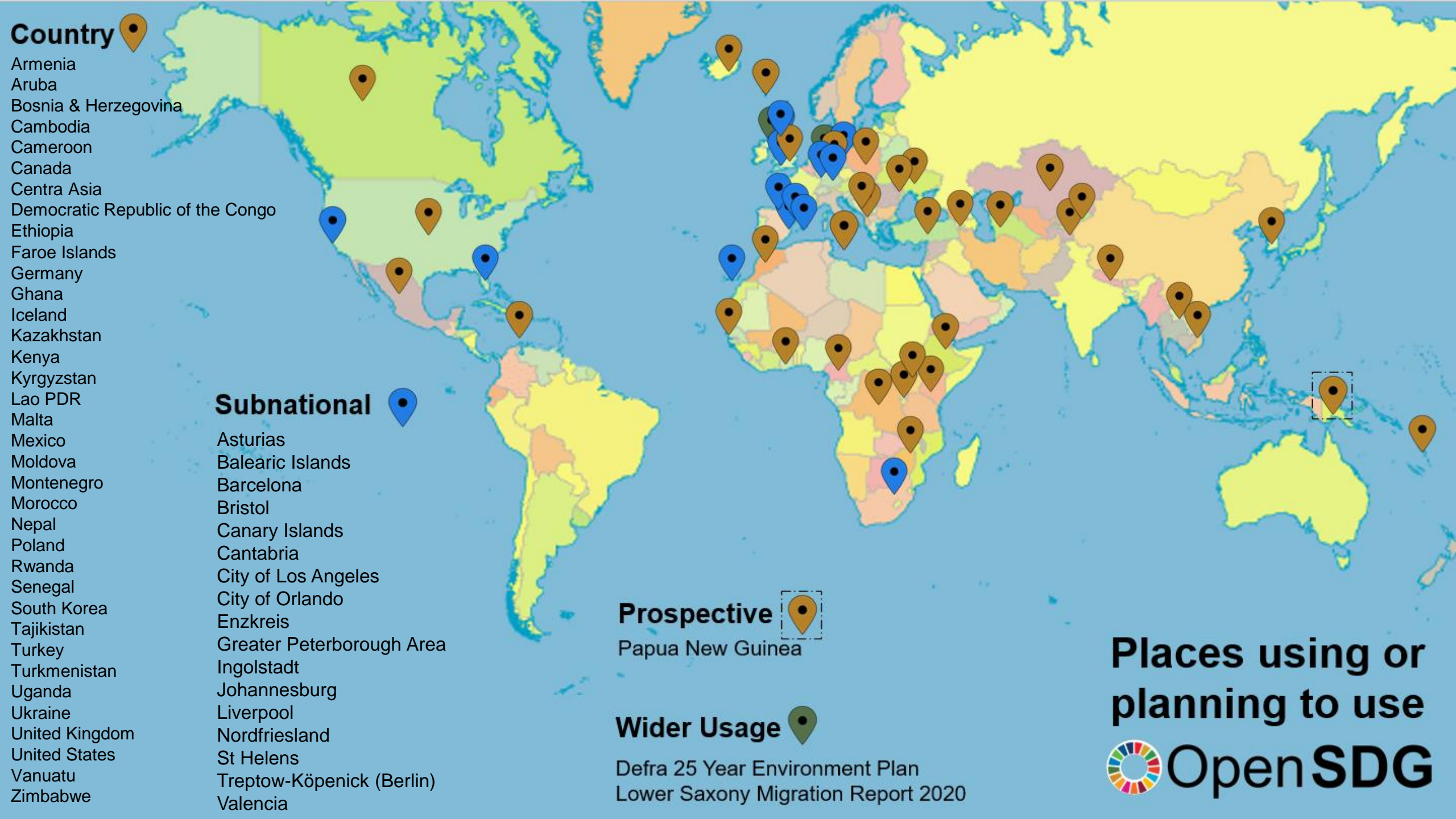

- Collaborate with other statistical organisations to improve Open SDG and National Statistics Office reporting – including United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD)

Case study - UNECA / ONS / UNSD joint workshop

- Held an in-country workshop in Zimbabwe with 7 African countries – Zimbabwe, Kenya, Ethiopia, Cameroon, Senegal, Morocco and Uganda
- UNECA facilitated the workshop
- UNSD delivered training on SDMX
- ONS delivered training on Open SDG
- By the end of the workshop, participants had the skills to convert their data into SDMX format and set up their National Reporting Platform
