responsiveness globally, has sought to consolidate its efforts when creating the law and subsequent body of the fund. Participating at this year's United Nations General Assembly, our UN partners delivered sobering messages of SDGs KPIs not being met, delays in the delivery of projects and objectives under the Sustainable Development Goals agenda. These alarming numbers reflect the slowing down of global efforts to respond to the world's development needs as a result of and the aftermath of the outbreak of COVID-19 corona virus. Some news narratives had us believe that the world stood still during those times, but as we know now, the needs of the world only grew deeper and mounted in urgency.

The chasm between needs and resources can now only be effectively bridged by accurate and updated data. The will and intension to aid those in need is alive and well. The renewed financial and political intensions of the global community echoed all through the UNGA 2024 week. Qatar and by proxy QFFD, also renewed its commitment towards helping those most vulnerable and in need of assistance.

The renewed commitment to Gaza of \$100 million US dollars in support and solidarity to our brothers and sisters undergoing the inhuman siege and daily bombardment is but one of many renewed commitments the State has pledged towards its stance for the rights of the people and to the delivery of the global SDGs.

Qatar fund has in its strategic objectives a focus in supporting developing and Least development countries. This is based on recipient needs and through a system of delivering on Qatar's international commitments and supporting the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals through strengthening local and international cooperation and partnerships in achieving the maximum amount of positive impact.

As our sector and cluster focus shifts from one SDG column to another, from healthcare to education, or economic reform back to healthcare, the mission remains one. Delivering on our commitments towards the successful achievements of the global goals of sustainable development towards the collective advancement of mankind and the realization of a peaceful and secure world.
